to: Authority for the County of Westchester to enter into an agreement with Dr. Eileen Re: Treacy, a licensed sexual abuse validator ("Consultant"), for the provision of comprehensive psychosocial evaluations of children and adolescents alleged to be victims of sexual abuse, for the period January 1, 2011 through December 31, 2011 in an amount not to exceed \$44,073 to be paid at an hourly rate of \$175 pursuant to an approved budget

and subject to appropriation

Authority is hereby requested for the County of Westchester, acting by and through its Department of Social Services to enter into an agreement with Dr. Eileen Treacy, a licensed sexual abuse validator ("Consultant"), trained to administer comprehensive psychosocial evaluations to children and adolescents alleged to be victims of sexual abuse, for the period January 1, 2011 through December 31, 2011, in an amount not to exceed \$44,073 to be paid at an hourly rate of \$175 pursuant to an approved budget and subject to appropriation. The contract amount requested is 6% less than that of 2010.

The proposed Agreement will serve a **public purpose** by assisting the County to provide appropriate services to children and adolescents alleged to be victims of sexual abuse. It is to be noted that these services are mandated by the state.

The goals and objectives of this contract are to provide timely, professional, expert assessments and evaluations of children alleged to have been sexually abused. Dr. Treacy completes psycho/social assessments for victims of child sexual abuse. She conducts interviews with the child and other persons significant to the allegations, such as the parents, caretakers, and other relevant persons such as Child Protective Services Caseworkers, Supervisors, County Attorneys and Law Guardians. The interview with the child is face-to-face, while the other contacts may include telephone interviews. Interviews may be videotaped at the request of CPS or when ordered by the court. An oral report is provided to CPS upon completion of the evaluation. A

written report delineating the findings is also provided to CPS. As Dr. Treacy specializes in the dynamics surrounding child sexual abuse, she can provide direction for CPS staff when there is no physical evidence or witness to corroborate the allegations. These assessments are extremely useful when the victim is young, and/or has limited language, and when the CPS interview alone is unproductive. The assessment and testimony are used to support CPS determinations and to obtain a finding in Court.

The goals and objectives are in the best interest of the County in terms of public safety and public health because the services provided pursuant to this contract promote the safety and health of the children in Westchester County by reducing the risk of abuse, neglect and maltreatment. The evaluations provided assist the Department to obtain mental health evidence used to validate whether or not sexual abuse occurred with young children. This service is closely monitored by the Child Protective Services Program Office which reviews and approves all requests for this service. High risk cases that need this type of expert consultation are preapproved and monitored for results. The Department receives expert quality services at a competitive price for this geographic area.

The goals and objectives are in the best interest of the County in terms of fiscal responsibility in that the services provided by the Consultant assist the Department in determining the appropriate level of services needed by the clients, thereby helping to avert placements and the costs associated with such placements. Further, because the services will be provided at an hourly rate, payments will be made for the actual time the Consultant spends on each case which, in turn, would provide for more accountability on the part of the Department and the Consultants.

The goals and objectives as stated in the resolution will be tracked and monitored to evaluate success using the performance measurement indicators developed by the Department and approved by the County Budget Office. They include, but are not limited to, reviewing of periodic reports submitted by the vendor and on-site visits.

Based on the statistics available as of August 31, 2010, Dr. Treacy has met the established measurement indicators set forth in the Scope of Work. Dr. Treacy has accepted and evaluated 100% of all referrals received.

This contract is exempt from the Westchester County Procurement Policy pursuant to Sections 3(a)(vii) and (viii).

We respectfully request the approval of the attached Resolution by your Honorable Board.

RESOLUTION

Upon a communication from the Acting Commissioner of the Department of Social Services, be it hereby

RESOLVED, that the County of Westchester is hereby authorized to enter into an agreement with Dr. Eileen Treacy, a licensed sexual abuse validator, trained to administer comprehensive psychosocial evaluations of children and adolescents alleged to be victims of sexual abuse, for the period January 1, 2011 through December 31, 2011, in an amount not to exceed \$44,073 to be paid at an hourly rate of \$175 pursuant to an approved budget; and be it further

RESOLVED, that this agreement is subject to County Appropriations; and be it further

RESOLVED, that this agreement is also subject to further financial analysis of the impact of any New York State Budget (the "State Budget") proposed and adopted during the term of this agreement. The County shall retain the right, upon the occurrence of any release by the Governor of a proposed State Budget and/or the adoption of a State Budget or any amendments thereto, and for a reasonable period of time after such release(s) or adoption(s), to conduct an analysis of the impacts of any such State Budget on County finances. After such analysis, the County shall retain the right to either terminate this agreement or renegotiate the amounts and rates approved herein. If the County subsequently offers to pay a reduced amount to the Contractor, then the Contractor shall have the right to terminate the agreement upon reasonable prior written notice; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the County Executive or his authorized designee is empowered to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate the purposes hereof.
