Re: Resolution authorizing the County of Westchester ("County") to enter into an agreement with Westchester Institute for Human Development ("WIHD") for a term commencing on January 1, 2011 and terminating on December 31, 2011 whereby WIHD, through its **"Enhanced Foster Care Program"**, will provide psycho-social in-home assessments of children placed or replaced in foster care, comprehensive developmental screening for children in foster care, foster parent training and respite/recreational services to identified foster children in an amount not to exceed \$559,055 to be paid pursuant to an approved budget and subject to future appropriation

Authority is requested for the County of Westchester to enter into an agreement with Westchester Institute for Human Development ("WIHD") whereby WIHD, through its **"Enhanced Foster Care Program"**, will provide psycho-social in-home assessments of children placed or replaced in foster care, comprehensive developmental screening for children in foster care, foster parent training and respite/recreational services to identified foster children in an amount not to exceed \$559,055 to be paid pursuant to an approved budget and subject to future appropriation for the period from January 1, 2011 through December 31, 2011.

The public purpose of this program is to ensure the well-being and permanency for children in foster care, as well as, to support the roles of foster parents taking care of children with difficult behaviors. The evaluations of children and families generated from this program assist in identifying, early in foster care placements, the service needs of children placed into care as well as their birth families. As a result of the assessments, services can be put into place to stabilize placements, reduce placement into more intensive levels of care and promote permanency planning by identifying services needed for birth parents for reunification with their children.



The services help to stabilize children newly placed or replaced into foster care in order to prevent replacement of children from one home to another and to identify the supports that foster parents need when taking care of children who are difficult to care for.

The goals and objective of this program are as follows:

- To stabilize foster care placements by ensuring that the service needs of children in foster care are met and that foster parents understand the needs of the children in their care
- To identify service needs for children newly placed in foster care
- To identify service needs, if any, for foster families to improve their ability to care for each child placed in the home
- To stabilize foster home placements, improve child wellbeing and reduce the rate of replacement of children from one home to another

The goals and objectives are in the best interests of the County in regards to public health and safety in that by providing screening, assessments, training, as well as respite, this program meets the needs of children in the care and custody of the Commissioner of Social Services. These services promote the advancement of the physical and mental well being of the most vulnerable children of Westchester County, children who have been abused or neglected and placed in foster care to ensure their safety. Providing these support services to children in foster care helps to identify and ameliorate child behavioral problems, which if left unchecked can lead to a deterioration of functioning and placement in higher levels of care.

Furthermore, they are in the best interests of the County in terms of fiscal responsibility for the reasons stated below:

- **Family Foster Care cost annualized per child.** The cost of foster care in a family foster setting can range from \$17.10 to \$58.65 per day per child depending on the age and level of care provided. That translates into an annualized foster care cost from **\$6,241.50 to \$21,407.25 per child per year.**
- **Residential Foster Care cost annualized per child.** The cost of residential foster care costs can range from \$50.22 up to \$562.00 per day per child, depending on the age and level of care provided. That translates into an annualized cost from **\$18,330.30 to \$205,130.00 per child per year.**
- **WIHD Enhanced Foster Care Program annualized per child cost.** The annualized program cost is \$559,055. As of October 31, 2010, WIHD has served 199 children. At this current rate of service, the cost for the contract year projects to be **\$2,809.32 per child per year.** The combined per child annual cost of family foster care and WIHD Enhanced Foster Care Program is less expensive than the cost of residential foster care.

The goals and objectives will be monitored using the performance measurement indicators developed by the department and approved by the County Budget Office. The vendor will submit monthly statistics and performance reports in the format approved by the Department. The program office will be responsible for setting the milestones and tracking their achievements. During the current contract period, DSS program staff maintains ongoing phone and face to face contact with the vendor and conducts regular site visits.

Based on the **Performance Measures Indicator**, the Department is able to report that as of October 31, 2010, the program succeeded in meeting its performance goals. The Enhanced Foster Care Program served an unduplicated 199 youth.

This agreement is exempt from the Westchester County Procurement Policy pursuant to Section 3 (a) viii of said policy.

An appropriate Resolution is attached herewith seeking your Honorable Board's approval.

RESOLUTION

Upon a communication from the Acting Commissioner of Social Services, be it hereby

RESOLVED, that the County of Westchester (“County”) is hereby authorized to enter into an agreement with Westchester Institute for Human Development (“WIHD”) whereby WIHD, through its “**Enhanced Foster Care Program**”, will provide psycho-social assessments of children placed in foster care, foster parent training and respite/recreational services to identified foster children in an amount not to exceed \$559,055 to be paid pursuant to an approved budget for the period from January 1, 2011 through December 31, 2011; and be it further

RESOLVED, that this Agreement is subject to County Appropriation; and be it further

RESOLVED, that this Agreement is also subject to further financial analysis of the impact of any New York State Budget (the “State Budget”) proposed and adopted during the term of this Agreement. The County shall retain the right, upon the occurrence of any release by the Governor of a proposed State Budget and/or the adoption of a State Budget or any amendments thereto, and for a reasonable period of time after such release(s) or adoption(s), to conduct an analysis of the impacts of any such State Budget on County finances. After such analysis, the County shall retain the right to either terminate the Agreement or to renegotiate the amounts and rates approved herein. If the County subsequently offers to pay a reduced amount to the Contractor, then the Contractor shall have the right to terminate this Agreement upon reasonable prior written notice; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the County Executive or his authorized designee is empowered to execute all documents necessary to effectuate the purposes hereof.
