RE: **Resolution to exempt from the Westchester County Procurement Policy the procurement of a contract for services with the Animal Welfare League of Westchester County, Inc. to provide public humane education programs in responsible dog ownership in an amount not to exceed Two Thousand (\$2,000) Dollars, commencing March 15, 2011 and expiring March 14, 2012**

For more than twenty (20) years, the County of Westchester (the "County") has contracted with the Animal Welfare League of Westchester County, Inc. (the "League") to provide a public humane education program in responsible dog ownership. Contracting with the League for the education program has permitted the County to fulfill its obligation pursuant to Section 111 of the New York Agriculture and Markets Law (the "Law") to utilize monies received from dog license fees for the purposes specified therein. According to the Law, the County received a portion of the dog license fees collected by its constituent municipalities. Beginning January 1, 2011, New York State ceased issuing dog licenses and turned over this responsibility to local municipalities. Since the County will no longer receive monies from the State for collected dog license fees, the amount of the proposed contract has been greatly reduced from last year.

The League is a New York not-for-profit corporation, which arranges for spaying and neutering, education, home to home pet adoption, emergency aid and numerous other services to benefit pets and their owners. The League is staffed primarily by volunteers and is supported by public contributions. As a result, the League can provide an extensive education program with a modest budget in the amount of Two Thousand (\$2,000) Dollars for the period March 15, 2011 through March 14, 2012. Because the League provides needed services, it would be in the best interest of the County to enter into the proposed agreement with the League.

During the course of this agreement, the League will assist and/or provide at least one hundred seventy-six (176) dog owners with free pet spaying and at least one thousand and

twenty (1,020) pet owners with reduced cost spaying. The League will also assist at least five hundred ten (510) needy pet owners in obtaining reduced veterinary bills through its outreach to local veterinarians and will provide at least four hundred twenty (420) pet food coupons to needy pet owners. The League will field at least eighty-five (85) calls regarding lost pets and will assist in recovering at least twenty-two (22) of those lost pets through their pet locating service. The League will also provide information and referral services to at least one hundred twenty-two (122) residents regarding rabies, wildlife and pet concerns and animal cruelty, and will provide information and services to at least eighty-seven (87) residents regarding prevention of cruelty to animals.

The League will submit quarterly statistical reports to the County as a basis for performance measurement.

The proposed agreement will serve the public interest by educating the public about the proper treatment of animals, including the need for spaying and neutering of pets, and the proper care and feeding of pets. The League assists residents who could not otherwise afford to keep their pets by providing pet food coupons and subsidizing the cost of spaying and neutering and other veterinary services. In addition, the League has successfully assisted many Westchester pet owners in locating their lost pets.

Given the exemplary performance of the League in its prior agreements with the County, it is proposed that the best interests of the County would be served by exempting the procurement of an agreement with the League from the procedures of the County's Procurement Policy. A separate resolution seeking your Honorable Board's approval of the proposed agreement has not been submitted herewith since the agreement is in an amount less than \$20,000, therefore Board of Acquisition and Contract approval is not required. However, it should be noted that the agreement will not be entered into unless your Honorable Board approves the attached resolution.

Accordingly, a resolution to exempt this agreement from procurement is hereby submitted for your consideration.
