SUBJECT: Authority to enter into a grant agreement with the New York State Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Services to accept \$66,000.00 in grant funding under the FY 2012 HazMat Grant Program for the period October 24, 2012 through August 31, 2014

Authorization is requested for the County of Westchester ("County"), acting by and through its Department of Emergency Services ("Department"), to enter into a grant agreement with the New York State Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Services ("DHSES") to accept FY 2012 Hazardous Materials ("HazMat") Grant Program funds in the amount of Sixty-Six Thousand (\$66,000.00) Dollars. The HazMat grant funds will be used to purchase HazMat containment system equipment which will build sustainable Chemical, Biological, Radiological, Nuclear and Explosives ("CBRNE") detection, response and decontamination capabilities and train appropriate personnel in the proper use of the equipment. The grant agreement is for the period commencing October 24, 2012 through August 31, 2014.

I certify that my department, a) has copies of, or access to, all applicable laws, rules, regulations, grant applications, and grant agreements (including any master grant agreement), as well as any guidance or instructions received from the agency making the grant (the "Grant Terms"), b) has reviewed the Grant Terms, c) is aware of and understands all of the Grant Terms, and d) can and will comply with all of the Grant Terms.

In order to receive funding from DHSES, the County is required to enter into a Regional Partnership Agreement ("RPA") with Dutchess County and Putnam County (collectively "the Regional Partners"). As you are aware inter-municipal agreements of this nature require governing body approval pursuant to §119-o of the New York State General Municipal Law. Legislation seeking authorization to enter into the RPA was approved by the County Board of Legislators on June 3, 2013, by Act No. 2013-106. Pursuant to Local Law 6-2012 (which is

pending review by the Appellate Division Second Department) approval of this RPA is not required by your Honorable Board as it is an inter-municipal agreement, subject only to Board of Legislator approval. It should be noted that funding for this initiative is provided by the DHSES under the FY 2012 HazMat Grant Program.

The goals and objectives of this program are to address vulnerabilities and develop protocols to meet target capabilities as outlined in the Federal Guidelines. This includes providing assistance to and support for surveillance, detection, interdiction, response, mitigation, operations and recovery from threats or acts of terrorism and man-made and natural hazards. The program will enhance the safety and security of Westchester County residents and will enhance the region's HazMat response and Mutual Aid capabilities to assess and manage the consequences of a hazardous materials release, either accidental or as part of a terrorist attack. The program will enable the County to strengthen CBRNE Detection, Response and Decontamination Capabilities.

The Department will be able to monitor the effectiveness of this effort through a series of performance measures required by DHSES.

Attached for your approval is an appropriate resolution.

## RESOLUTION
