**RE: RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY OF WESTCHESTER TO 1)
ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH THE NEW YORK STATE OFFICE OF
CHILDREN AND FAMILY SERVICES TO ACCEPT A GRANT IN AN
AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$146,362, WITH THE COUNTY CONTRIBUTING
\$8,461 IN COUNTY MATCHING FUNDS, FOR THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S
OFFICE TO OPERATE THE MULTIDISCIPLINARY TEAM AND CHILD
ADVOCACY CENTER GRANT PROGRAM FOR THE PERIOD FEBRUARY 1,
2014 THROUGH JANUARY 31, 2015; AND 2) CONTRACT WITH
WESTCHESTER JEWISH COMMUNITY SERVICES, INC. IN AN AMOUNT
NOT-TO-EXCEED \$24,661, AND WITH THE WESTCHESTER INSTITUTE
FOR HUMAN DEVELOPMENT (WIHD) IN AN AMOUNT NOT-TO-EXCEED \$
10,839, PURSUANT TO APPROVED BUDGETS, FOR PURPOSES OF
IMPLEMENTING THE GRANT, FOR THE PERIOD FEBRUARY 1, 2014
THROUGH JANUARY 31, 2015.**

Authority is sought for the County of Westchester (the "County") to 1) enter into an agreement with the New York State Office of Children and Family Services ("OCFS") to accept a grant in an amount not to exceed \$146,362 in state funds, with the County contributing \$8,461 in County matching funds, for the District Attorney's Office to operate the Multidisciplinary Team and Child Advocacy Center Grant Program (the "Grant") for the period February 1, 2014 through January 31, 2015; and 2) contract with Westchester Jewish Community Services, Inc. ("WJCS") in an amount not-to-exceed \$24,661, and with the Westchester Institute for Human Development (WIHD) in an amount not-to-exceed \$10,839, pursuant to approved budgets, for purpose of implementing the Grant, for the period February 1, 2014 through January 31, 2015.

The Multidisciplinary Team and Child Advocacy Center Grant ("MDT/CAC") provides the funding necessary for the coordination of all investigations that pertain to all suspected child abuse or maltreatment throughout Westchester County. It enables the successful investigation and prosecution of child abuse cases and comprehensive allocation of services for the therapeutic treatment of child victims. This process is coordinated through the Investigations Information Coordinator who ensures all team members are joined in any specific investigation and attend scheduled forensic interviews and medical exams of the child victim at the Child Advocacy Center. This process has successfully limited victims from being interviewed more than once by multiple agencies and preserved crucial prosecutorial evidence which has well enhanced

prosecutorial cases. The MDT/CAC not only provides child victims a safe friendly environment to receive medical and therapeutic services, but also a place where a child can report any occurring abuse to law enforcement officials.

Pursuant to the contract with WJCS, the agency will provide a Mental Health Coordinator (“MHC”) who will be available to the victim and family during the interview and examination process and a supervisor who will oversee the MHC to ensure that team services are being provided.

Pursuant to the contract with WIHD the agency will provide staff and programmatic oversight to the CAC in close collaboration with the IIC at the DA’s office as well as staff at the CAC and other MDT program staff as needed. Role includes sharing on-call coverage for CAC and tracking case activities and outcomes using NCAtrak.

In addition, a portion of the grant funds will be used directly by the District Attorney's Office to provide a Senior Domestic Violence Aide who will act as the MDT investigations information coordinator. This coordinator will review reports of child abuse to the State Central Registry provided by Child Protective Services (“CPS”) to the District Attorney's Office and ensure that timely notification of cases is made to law enforcement, CPS, and the Child Advocacy Coordinator .

The goals and objectives of the Grant are to prevent duplication of interviews, increase the use of the Children’s Advocacy Center by law enforcement, enhance prosecution by the immediate collection of evidence and help the establishment of state approved protocols for Westchester’s MDT/CAC.

The goals and objectives are in the best interest of the County in terms of public safety by promoting the health, safety and welfare of children who have been the victims of abuse or are suspected of being victims of abuse by enabling the County to increase the use of the CAC, limit the number of child interviews, encourage sound forensic interviews and investigations, and assist the County in State approval of the Multidisciplinary Team.

The goals and objectives will be monitored by the Office of the District Attorney and quarterly progress reports are submitted to the OCFS for their review and approval.

Because the Agreement with OCFS is for the acceptance of grant funds, it does not constitute a procurement and, as such, is not subject to the Westchester County Procurement Policy. The agreement with WJCS and WIHD are exempt from the Procurement Policy pursuant to Sections 3(a)(viii) and 3(a)(xviii) thereof.

I certify that my department, a) has copies of, or access to, all applicable laws, rules, regulations, grant applications, and grant agreements (including any master grant agreement), as well as any guidance or instructions received from the agency making the grant (the “Grant Terms”), b) has reviewed the Grant Terms, c) is aware of and understands all of the Grant Terms, and d) can and will comply with all of the Grant Terms.

Accordingly, approval of the attached resolution is most respectfully requested.

RESOLUTION

Upon communication from Janet DiFiore, District Attorney, be it hereby

RESOLVED, that the County of Westchester is authorized to 1) enter into an agreement with the New York State Office of Children and Family Services to accept a grant in an amount not to exceed \$146,362 with the County contributing \$8,461 in County matching funds, to operate the Multidisciplinary Team and Child Advocacy Center Grant (the “Grant”) for the period February 1, 2014 through January 31, 2015; and 2) contract with Westchester Jewish Community Services, Inc. (“WJCS”) in an amount not-to-exceed \$24,661 and with the Westchester Institute for Human Development (“WIHD”) in an amount not-to-exceed \$10,839, pursuant to approved budgets, for purposes of implementing the Grant for the period February 1, 2014 through January 31, 2015; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the agreements with WJCS and WIHD are subject to County Appropriations; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the agreements with WJCS and WIHD are also subject to the further financial analysis of the impact of any New York State Budget (the “State Budget”) proposed and adopted during the term of these agreements. The County shall retain the right, upon the occurrence of any release by the Governor of a proposed State Budget and/or the adoption of a State Budget or any amendments thereto, and for a reasonable period of time after such release(s) or adoption(s), to conduct an analysis of the impacts of any such State Budget on County finances. After such analysis, the County shall retain the right to either terminate the Agreements or to renegotiate the amounts and rates approved herein. If the County subsequently offers to pay a reduced amount to WJCS, then WJCS shall have the right to terminate this Agreement upon reasonable prior written notice; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the District Attorney or her duly authorized designee is hereby empowered to execute any and all documents necessary to accomplish the purposes of this resolution.
