Resolution to exempt from the Westchester County Procurement Policy an Re:

> Agreement with Westchester Community Opportunity Program, Inc. ("WestCOP") for the provision of assistance to low-income households in the application process for regular and emergency heating benefits (HEAP program) pursuant to Section 3(a)

Authority is hereby requested from your Honorable Board to exempt from the Westchester County Procurement Policy and Procedures an agreement with Westchester Community Opportunity Program, Inc. ("WestCOP") for the provision of assistance to low-income households in the application process for regular and emergency heating benefits (HEAP program) for the term commencing October 1, 2014 and ending September 30, 2015 in an amount not to exceed \$27,200 payable pursuant to an approved program budget.

HEAP is a federally funded energy program intended to provide assistance to low income households in meeting their immediate home energy needs. All administrative monies for this program flow through the Social Services District. The Department of Social Services is tasked with establishing its local certification network within the district to administer HEAP. Accordingly, the Westchester County Department of Social Services selected "WestCOP", a Community Based Organization ("CBO") as its certifier and the Westchester County Department of Social Services has contracted with this organization for the last several years for the provision of outreach, intake and certification of HEAP applications.

Based on the expertise, experience and familiarity of "WestCOP" in working with the HEAP program and the fact that the contractor, a community based organization, is a certifier for the County in this regard, WestCOP is uniquely qualified to deliver the intended services. Therefore, it is proposed that
