SUBJECT: Authority to exempt from the Westchester County Procurement Policy an agreement with United Community Center of Westchester, Inc. to assist immigrants in need of civil legal representation, for a term commencing January 1, 2015 and continuing through December 31, 2015, for an amount not-to-exceed \$10,300

The attached Resolution, if approved by your Honorable Board, would authorize the County of Westchester, acting by and through its Office for Women, (the "County") to exempt from the Westchester County Procurement Policy an agreement (the "Agreement") with United Community Center of Westchester, Inc. ("UCCW") pursuant to which UCCW will assist immigrants in need of civil legal representation, for a term commencing January 1, 2015 and continuing through December 31, 2015, for an amount not-to-exceed \$10,300, payable quarterly, pursuant to an approved budget.

Since its inception in 2005, UCCW has provided critical resources that bring health care, education, food, refuge and emergency assistance to help those in need in an effort to assure that basic human necessities are provided for Westchester's vulnerable populations, including immigrants, victims of domestic violence, at-risk youth, disabled, elderly and homeless individuals/families. In addition, UCCW has established partnerships with local service providers to create a support system for its clients.

The proposed Agreement will serve a public purpose by connecting immigrants to legal services that they need and might otherwise be unable to obtain. Furthermore, immigrants have language and cultural barriers when using legal system and may be fearful of immigration issues.

The goals and objectives of the proposed Agreement are for UCCW to provide immigrants with services including, but not limited to: information and referral to legal agencies or attorneys as appropriate; follow-up with case process; accompaniment to court or to other agencies, as necessary; and data collection.

The goals and objectives of the proposed Agreement will be tracked and monitored by the Office for Women.

Under the Westchester County Procurement Policy Section 3(a)(xxi), your Honorable Board may determine "by resolution passed prior to commencing procurement that compliance with the Procurement Policy would not be in the best interests of the County." Due to the fact that UCCW has the necessary experience and expertise to provide these services to immigrants in Westchester, and for the reasons set forth above, it is requested that your Honorable Board make the determination that it is in the best interests of the County to exempt from the application of the procedural requirements of the Westchester County Procurement Policy the proposed Agreement with UCCW.

Attached for your consideration is a proposed Resolution.

RESOLUTION

Upon a communication from the Director of the Office for Women and the Chairman of the Westchester County Board of Legislators, be it hereby

RESOLVED, that pursuant to Section 3(a)(xxi) of the Westchester County Procurement Policy, it is hereby determined that application of the procedural requirements contained therein, including the necessity of soliciting written price quotations, is neither cost effective nor expedient, and accordingly, not in the best interests of the County in connection with the procurement of an agreement with United Community Center of Westchester, Inc. pursuant to which United Community Center of Westchester, Inc. will assist immigrants in need of civil legal representation.
