SUBJECT: Resolution authorizing the County of Westchester to enter into an intermunicipal agreement with the Town of Cortlandt in connection with the distribution of \$170,720 of the East of Hudson Water Quality Investment Program Fund, for which the County is custodian under the 1997 Watershed Memorandum of Agreement, in order to finance a portion of the eligible costs associated with the purchase of two vacuum trucks and the maintenance of the vacuum trucks for the duration of their useful life

Authority is being requested of your Honorable Board for the County of Westchester (the "County") to enter into an intermunicipal agreement (the "IMA") with the Town of Cortlandt (the "Town") in order to distribute funds of the East of Hudson Water Quality Investment Program Fund (the "EOH WQIP Fund"), for which the County serves as custodian under the New York City Watershed Memorandum of Agreement, to finance a portion of the eligible costs associated with the purchase of two vacuum trucks for use within the New York City Department of Environmental Protection water supply watershed and for the maintenance of the vacuum trucks for the duration of their useful life. The not-to-exceed amount of the IMA is \$170,720 (the "EOH Funds") and the term of the IMA will commence upon the execution of the IMA and terminate five (5) years thereafter.

The purpose of the Town's use of the EOH Funds is to assist in the funding of the purchase of two vacuum trucks and for the maintenance of the vacuum trucks for the duration of their useful life. The estimated total cost of the vacuum trucks is \$432,121 of which up to \$170,720 will be funded through the EOH Funds.

On February 13, 2017, the County Board of Legislators (the "Board") pursuant to Act No. 2017-36 authorized the County to transfer the EOH Funds into a County Trust Account in order to finance a portion of the eligible costs associated with the approved purchase of two vacuum trucks and maintenance of the vacuum trucks for the duration of their useful life.

On February 13, 2017, the Board pursuant to Act No. 2017-37, authorized the County to enter into the IMA with the Town in order to distribute the EOH Funds to fund a portion of the

Town's costs associated with the purchase of two vacuum trucks and maintenance of the vacuum trucks for the duration of their useful life.

The goal and objective of the IMA is to protect the public health and provide a safer environment by improving water quality. The Department of Planning will monitor the IMA by reviewing documentation provided by the Town.

I recommend approval of the attached resolution.

RESOLUTION

UPON A COMMUNICATION FROM THE ACTING COMMISSIONER OF PLANNING, BE IT HEREBY

RESOLVED, that the County of Westchester is hereby authorized to enter into an Intermunicipal Agreement (the “IMA”) with the Town of Cortlandt to issue funds from the East of Hudson Water Quality Investment Program Fund to finance a portion of the costs for the purchase of two vacuum trucks and for the maintenance of the vacuum trucks for the duration of their useful life. The not-to-exceed amount of the funds is \$170,720 and the term of the IMA will commence upon the signing of the IMA and terminate five (5) years thereafter; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the County Executive or his duly authorized designee is authorized to execute any documents and take any actions necessary to effectuate purposes hereof.
