Re: **Resolution to exempt from the Westchester County Procurement Policy an Agreement with Westchester Community Opportunity Program, Inc. (“WestCOP”) for the provision of assistance to low-income households in the application process for regular and emergency heating benefits (HEAP program) pursuant to Section 3(a) xxi thereof**

Authority is hereby requested from your Honorable Board to exempt from the Westchester County Procurement Policy and Procedures an agreement with Westchester Community Opportunity Program, Inc. (“WestCOP”) for the provision of assistance to low-income households in the application process for regular and emergency heating benefits (HEAP program) for the term commencing October 1, 2017 and ending September 30, 2018 in an amount not to exceed \$27,200 payable pursuant to an approved program budget.

The program (HEAP) is intended to provide assistance to low income households in meeting their immediate home energy needs. All administrative monies for this program flow through the Social Services District. The Department of Social Services is tasked with establishing its local certification network within the district to administer HEAP. Accordingly, the Westchester County Department of Social Services selected “WestCOP”, a Community Based Organization (“CBO”) as its certifier and the Westchester County Department of Social Services has contracted with this organization for the last several years for the provision of outreach, intake and certification of HEAP applications.

Based on the expertise, experience and familiarity of “WestCOP” in working with the HEAP program and the fact that the contractor, a community based organization, is a certifier for the County in this regard, WestCOP is uniquely qualified to deliver the intended services. Therefore, it is proposed that the best interests of the County would be served by entering into this agreement with Westchester Community Opportunity Program, Inc. (“WestCOP”) for its continued assistance with the operation of the

HEAP application process for regular and emergency heating benefits (HEAP program). This recommendation is made pursuant to Section 3(a) (xxi) of the Westchester County Procurement Policy.

Pursuant to Section 3(a) xxi, the Westchester County Procurement Policy and Procedures are not applicable to any procurement for which this Honorable Board determines, by resolution passed prior to commencing such procurement, that compliance with the Policy would not be in the best interests of the County. A separate resolution has been submitted requesting authority to enter into this agreement.

Accordingly, a resolution to exempt this procurement is hereby submitted for your Honorable Board's consideration.
