SUBJECT: Authority to enter into a total of seven (7) agreements with the seven (7) agencies listed below for the purpose of operating youth employment programs for economically disadvantaged youth, ages 16-24, under the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act of 2014, PL 113-128, and its implementing regulations (“WIOA”), for a total aggregate amount not to exceed \$1,252,260.00 for the period from July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020.

Authority is requested for the County of Westchester (the “County”), acting by and through its Department of Social Services Office of Workforce Development (the “Department”), to enter into a total of **seven (7) agreements** with seven (7) agencies, as listed below, for the purpose of operating, as specified below, youth employment programs for economically disadvantaged youth, ages 16-24, under WIOA, for the period from July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020, with the County having the option, in its sole discretion, to extend the term of each agreement for up to one-year (1), with one-year (1) extension, subject to funding availability and past performance. In consideration for services rendered, the agencies shall be paid a total aggregate amount not-to-exceed \$1,252,260.00 in the individual not-to-exceed amounts set forth below, pursuant to approved budgets.

The proposed Agreements will serve a public purpose by facilitating the Westchester Putnam Workforce Development Academy for Youth (WDAY) pursuant to WIOA, to operate youth employment programs which will enhance graduation rates, workforce skills and self sufficiency among the youth of Westchester and Putnam Counties.

The goals and objectives of the proposed agreements are to serve no less than 305 youth and achieve the following outcomes:

- Placement in employment or education at a rate of 70.5% for the first and third quarters after exit
- Attainment of a degree or certificate at a rate of 65.9%
- Literacy and Numeracy at a rate of 56.7%

The goals and objectives of the proposed agreements are in the best interest of the County in terms of public safety because the youth are less likely to engage in negative social behavior while they are participants in this program. The goals and objectives of the proposed agreements are also in the best interests of the County in terms of fiscal responsibility, as participants who are economically disadvantaged are more likely to become self sufficient as they obtain educational assistance, job training and other skills necessary to prepare them for the job market. This program would reduce their dependence on public assistance and other related programs as many of them would obtain higher education and employment.

The goals and objectives of the proposed agreements will be monitored and tracked via monthly reports submitted by the contractors. The program staff will review all youth data, including services and outcomes, in the New York State Department of Labor (“NYSDOL”) One Stop Operating System.

The Department has complied with Section 13 of the Westchester County Procurement Policy (the “Policy”). On April 12, 2019 the Department, on behalf of the Westchester County Office of Workforce Investment, issued an RFP to solicit proposals from public and private non-profit agencies to deliver youth employment services to various communities in Westchester and Putnam Counties under the WDAY of Westchester and Putnam Counties. The RFP was posted on the County and One Stop websites, the Journal News and emailed to various One Stop partners. Each of the seven (7) agencies listed above submitted proposals in response to the RFP. Following a review of each proposal with reference to the evaluation criteria set forth in the RFP, the review committee recommended that each agency be awarded one contract to serve participants in the Westchester Putnam Workforce Development Academy for Youth.

Accordingly, I most respectfully recommend approval of the attached resolution.
