SUBJECT:

1. Authority for the County of Westchester (the "County"), acting by and through its Department of Social Services (the "Department") to enter into an agreement with the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development in order to accept a grant under HUD's continuum of Care program in the amount of \$458,872 to be used to fund the services of a Department Program Administrator and associated costs to coordinate all aspects of the Department's Coordinated Entry System as well as the costs of seven shelters which will provide the Coordinated Entry Services to homeless individuals in their facilities;
2. Authority for the County to enter into agreements with seven shelters to provide the Coordinated Entry Services to homeless individuals in their facilities for the period from March 1, 2019 through February 28, 2020.

Authority is respectfully requested from your Honorable Board for the County of Westchester (the "County"), acting by and through its Department of Social Services (the "Department"), to enter into an agreement (the "Grant Agreement") with the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development ("HUD") in order to accept a grant (Grant No. NY1050L2T041803) under HUD's Continuum of Care program in the amount of \$458,872 for the period from March 1, 2019 through February 28, 2020 ("the "Grant"). The Grant will be used to fund the services of a Program Administrator, position (salary and fringe) at \$158,865, as well as administrative costs of \$9,813. The Program Administrator will work with the Department's wide array of Continuum of Care partners to ensure that the Coordinated Entry System (defined below) functions to properly and efficiently assess, prioritize and then refer eligible households to homelessness assistance in Westchester County. Coordinated Entry is a process developed and mandated by HUD to ensuring that access to homeless services in a

community is streamlined and that households that are experiencing or are at-risk for homelessness are able to quickly access the assistance they need and for which they are eligible, without having to call or be turned away from multiple programs.

The remainder of the Grant funds, \$290,194 will be used to fund the operation of this program by seven shelters listed below with which the County will enter into agreements (the "Shelter Agreements") for the time period from March 1, 2019 through February 28, 2020. The amounts of each Shelter Agreement shall not exceed the amounts listed below (the "NTE Amount(s)"). As required by the Grant, the County will provide matching funds in the sum of \$42,186.00 and the shelters collectively will provide matching funds in the amount of \$72,550.00 as provided below. All such matching funds will be in the form of funds actually spent in excess of the Grant funds in furtherance of the Coordinated Entry System.

Accordingly, authority is respectfully requested from your Honorable Board for the County to enter into the Shelter Agreements with the above listed agencies for the operation of the Coordinated Entry System during the time period from March 1, 2019 through February 28, 2020. The amounts of the Shelter Agreements shall not exceed the amounts listed above.

Matching funds in the sum of \$42,186 as required by the Grant will be provided by the County and match funds in the amount of \$72,550.00 as required by the Grant will be provided by the shelters collectively.

I certify that my department, a) has copies of, or access to, all applicable laws, rules, regulations, grant applications, and grant agreements (including any master grant agreement), as well as any guidance or instructions received from the agency making the grant (the "Grant Terms"), b) has reviewed the Grant Terms, c) is aware of and understands all of the Grant Terms, and d.) and will comply with all of the Grant Terms.

The Grant Agreement with HUD does not involve the procurement of goods or services from a third party and therefore the provisions of the Common Grant Rules and the Westchester County Procurement Policy do not apply.

The Shelter Agreements are exempt from the Westchester County Procurement Policy pursuant to Section 3(a) xiv.

The proposed agreements will serve a public purpose by providing a Program Administrator to coordinate all aspects of implementing our Coordinated Entry System and to

quickly and efficiently provide homeless persons access to the assistance they need and for which they are eligible, without having to call or be turned away from multiple programs.

The goals and objectives of the proposed agreements are to provide a Coordinated Entry Administrator who will work with the Department's wide array of Continuum of Care partners to define and reach consensus on how to implement the new processes required to create a fully functional Coordinated Entry System in order to better serve our homeless population.

The goals and objectives of the proposed agreement are in the best interests of the County in terms of fiscal responsibility as the proposed agreement will make available to the County the funds necessary to implement the aforementioned program. Further, the goals and objectives of the proposed agreement are also in the best interests of the County in terms of both public health and safety as the programs funded by the proposed agreement will be aimed at ensuring the well being and safety of the targeted population and addressing the issues of homelessness and welfare dependency in the County which can reduce the costs associated with social services provided by the County.

The goals and objectives of the proposed agreement will be tracked and monitored by the Department in accordance with the requirements of HUD. The Department will be required to submit Annual Progress Reports to HUD as a requirement of receiving the funding to be provided under the proposed agreement. These multi-page Annual Progress Reports capture statistical data on those served, the various categories they fall into, the milestones reached, the money expended, etc., which must match the program outlined in the Department's Technical Submission.

I respectfully recommend your Honorable Board's approval of the attached Resolution.

RESOLVED, that the County is hereby authorized to enter into agreements with each of the following agencies for the operation of the Coordinated Entry System during the time period from March 1, 2019 through February 28, 2020, in the amounts not to exceed the "NTE amounts" listed below:
