SUBJECT: Resolution authorizing the agreement between the County of Westchester and the Croton-Cortlandt Food Pantry in order to provide an emergency food service program in the Village of Croton-on-Hudson and the Town of Cortlandt to households impacted by COVID-19 under the Community Development Block Grant – Coronavirus grant Emergency Food Distribution Assistance project.

The attached resolution authorizes the County of Westchester (“County”) to enter into an agreement with the Croton-Cortlandt Food Pantry to provide a grant from the Emergency Food Distribution Assistance Grant through the Community Development Block Grant - Coronavirus grant Emergency Food Distribution Assistance project. The grant funds awarded to the Croton-Cortlandt Food Pantry will be used to provide assistance to households who have been adversely impacted by the Coronavirus Pandemic. The amount of the grant is \$40,000.00, pursuant to an approved budget, and the term of the agreement is December 15, 2020 to December 14, 2021.

The Croton-Cortlandt Food Pantry will participate in the Emergency Food Distribution Assistance project by operating an outdoor walk through food pick up system twice a month with no limits on the number of visits by residents. The services are available to food insecure residents of the Village of Croton-on-Hudson and the Town of Cortlandt and any other food insecure household. The Pantry walk through services have quadrupled in the number of bags of food distributed. Currently 20,000 pounds of food are distributed monthly.

The goal and objective of this agreement is to help the low and moderate households of the Village of Croton-on-Hudson and the Town of Cortlandt who are experiencing food insecurity. The program will be monitored by the Westchester County Department of Planning staff, who will review all payment requests to ensure all contractual requirements are met.

The Department of Planning issued a Request For Proposals on June 15, 2020 on the County’s website, seeking proposals from non-profit agencies who are 501(c)(3) organizations to apply for a grant from the Community Development Block Grant – Coronavirus grant. This program addresses food insecurity for individual or family households. As of July 21, 2020 thirteen (13) organizations submitted proposals; Church of Our Lady of Mount Carmel, Larchmont

Mamaroneck Hunger Task Force, Inc., Croton-Cortlandt Food Pantry, Port Chester Carver Center, Caritas of Port Chester, Inc., Ossining Food Pantry, The Salvation Army Tarrytown/Sleepy Hollow Corps, The Mount Kisco Interfaith Food Pantry, Gullotta House - Sleepy Hollow/Tarrytown, Gullotta House – Ossining Village, Gullotta House Mount Kisco and the Village of Rye Brook.

The following organizations will receive funding as they submitted comparable proposals, Church of Our Lady of Mount Carmel - \$50,000, Larchmont Mamaroneck Hunger Task Force, Inc. \$50,000, Croton-Cortlandt Food Pantry - \$40,000, Port Chester Carver Center - \$30,000, Caritas of Port Chester, Inc. - \$30,000, Ossining Food Pantry - \$50,000, The Salvation Army Tarrytown/Sleepy Hollow Corps - \$100,000, and The Mount Kisco Interfaith Food Pantry - \$50,000. Separate resolutions will be submitted for authority to enter into agreements with each organization awarded above \$35,000. Those organization awarded \$30,000 will receive short-form contracts.

I recommend approval of this agreement.
