SUBJECT: Resolution authorizing the agreement between the County of Westchester and The Salvation Army in order to provide an emergency food service program in the Villages of Tarrytown and Sleepy Hollow to households impacted by COVID-19 under the Community Development Block Grant - Coronavirus grant Emergency Food Distribution Assistance project.

The attached resolution authorizes the County of Westchester (“County”) to enter into an agreement with The Salvation Army to provide a grant from the Community Development Block Grant - Coronavirus grant Food Distribution Assistance project. The grant funds awarded to The Salvation Army will be used to provide assistance to households who have been adversely impacted by the Coronavirus Pandemic. The amount of the grant is \$100,000.00, pursuant to an approved budget, and the term of the agreement is December 15, 2020 to December 14, 2021.

The Salvation Army will participate in the Emergency Food Distribution Assistance project by providing grab-and-go meals, food boxes, home food deliveries and mobile feeding programs in the Villages of Tarrytown and Sleepy Hollow. Due to Coronavirus there has been a major increase in the number of families experiencing food insecurities. Prior to the pandemic approximately 150 families received assistance; that number has increased to 400 families as of March of 2020. This grant award will provide financial support for a portion of the operating costs associated with the grab-and-go meals, food boxes, home food deliveries and mobile feeding programs.

The goal and objective of this agreement is to help low and moderate households in the Villages of Tarrytown and Sleepy Hollow who are experiencing food insecurities. The program will be monitored by the Westchester County Department of Planning staff, who will review all payment requests to ensure all contractual requirements are met.

The Department of Planning issued a Request For Proposals on June 15, 2020 on the County’s website, seeking proposals from non-profit agencies who are 501(c)(3) organizations to apply for a grant from the Community Development Block Grant - Coronavirus grant. This program addresses food insecurity for individual or family households. As of July 21, 2020 thirteen (13)

organizations submitted proposals; Church of Our Lady of Mount Carmel, Larchmont Mamaroneck Hunger Task Force, Inc., Croton-Cortlandt Food Pantry, Port Chester Carver Center, Caritas of Port Chester, Inc., Ossining Food Pantry, The Salvation Army Tarrytown/Sleepy Hollow Corps, The Mount Kisco Interfaith Food Pantry, Gullotta House - Sleepy Hollow/Tarrytown, Gullotta House – Ossining Village, Gullotta House Mount Kisco and the Village of Rye Brook.

The County will seek to enter into agreement with the following organizations as well as they submitted comparable proposals: Church of Our Lady of Mount Carmel - \$50,000, Larchmont Mamaroneck Hunger Task Force, Inc. \$50,000, Croton-Cortlandt Food Pantry - \$40,000, Port Chester Carver Center - \$30,000, Caritas of Port Chester, Inc. - \$30,000, Ossining Food Pantry - \$50,000, The Salvation Army Tarrytown/Sleepy Hollow Corps - \$100,000, and The Mount Kisco Interfaith Food Pantry - \$50,000. Separate resolutions will be submitted for authority to enter into agreements for those organization in excess of \$35,000, and short form contract approval will be sought for the remaining

I recommend approval of this agreement.

The term of the agreement is December 15, 2020 to December 14, 2021.
