RE: Authority to enter into inter-municipal agreements with one or more of the municipalities located in Westchester County for the use of the County's Firing Range located at the County's Police Academy in Valhalla, New York for firearms training

Authorization is requested for the County of Westchester ("County"), acting by and through its Department of Public Safety Services (the "Department"), to enter into inter-municipal agreements ("IMAs") with one or more Westchester County municipal corporations as defined in Article 5-G of the New York State General Municipal Law ("Municipality") in order to have public safety employees from such Municipalities utilize the County's Firing Range located at the County's Police Academy in Valhalla, New York ("Firing Range") for firearms training. The IMAs will have five (5) year term commencing upon execution and both parties will have the right to terminate the agreement on thirty (30) days notice to the other.

In exchange for the use of the Firing Range, which will be staffed by a Department safety officer, each Municipality will pay a flat fee of Six Hundred and Thirty (\$630.00) Dollars per eight hour tour, for a maximum number of 36 officers in attendance. This charge is based solely on a blended hourly rate for the Department's safety officer that accommodates straight time and overtime costs. The Firing Range will be operated under the direction of the safety officer. The Municipality will adhere to all instructions issued by the Department's safety officer.

In the event that police officers from a Municipality provide instruction at the County's Police Academy located in Valhalla, New York, under separate agreement between the County and the Municipality, the Commissioner of the Department, or his designee, may provide such Municipality with a credit equal to one eight hour tour at the Firing Range for each seven (7) hours of instruction at the Police Academy.

The County has entered into of number of IMAs since 2008 with municipalities throughout Westchester to use the Firing Range for firearms training. The program has proven successful and it is recommended that the County continue this valuable program. In furtherance

thereof, the Westchester County Board of Legislators authorized these agreements at a meeting duly held on April 16, 2012 by Act No. 25-2012, subject to the stipulation that the Act would only be effective through December 31, 2013.

The goals and objectives of this program are to ensure that the Westchester County local municipal police departments have available to them this state of the art Firing Range. The proposed IMAs are in the public's best interest and will promote the safety and general welfare of the public by ensuring that the Westchester County law enforcement officers are trained and recertified in a suitable environment.

The Department will monitor these agreements as Public Safety staff manage the facility and are present during all training sessions.

Based upon the foregoing, I most respectfully recommend approval of the attached Resolution.

RESOLUTION

Upon a communication from the Commissioner-Sheriff of Public Safety, be it hereby

RESOLVED, that the County of Westchester (the “County”), acting by and through its Department of Public Safety Services (“Department”), is hereby authorized to enter into inter-municipal agreements (“IMAs”) with one or more Westchester County municipal corporations as defined in Article 5-G of the New York State General Municipal Law (“Municipality”) in order to have public safety employees from such Municipalities utilize the County’s Firing Range located at the County’s Police Academy in Valhalla, New York (“Firing Range”) for firearms training for a five year term commencing upon execution, with a mutual right to terminate the agreement on thirty (30) days notice to the other; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that in exchange for the use of the Firing Range, which will be staffed by a Department safety officer, each Municipality will pay a flat fee of Six Hundred and Thirty (\$630.00) Dollars per eight hour tour, for a maximum number of 36 officers in attendance. This charge is based solely on a blended hourly rate for the Department’s safety officer that accommodates straight time and overtime costs. The Firing Range will be operated under the direction of the safety officer and the Municipality will adhere to all instructions issued by the Department’s safety officer; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that in the event that police officers from a Municipality provide instruction at the County’s Police Academy located in Valhalla, New York, under separate agreement between the County and the Municipality, the Commissioner of the Department, or his designee, may provide such Municipality with a credit equal to one eight hour tour at the Firing Range for each seven (7) hours of instruction at the Police Academy; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the County Executive or his authorized designee is authorized and empowered to execute and deliver all instruments and take all actions necessary or appropriate to effectuate the purposes hereof.
