RE: Resolution authorizing the County of Westchester to enter into an agreement with the State of New York, acting by and through its Division of Criminal Justice Services, to accept a grant in the amount not to exceed \$305,400.00, in State funds for the Department of Public Safety to participate in the Aid to Crime Labs Program for the period July 1, 2013 through June 30, 2014 pursuant to an approved budget.

Authority is sought for the County of Westchester (the "County") to enter into an agreement with the State of New York, acting by and through its Division of Criminal Justice Services ("DCJS"), pursuant to which the County will accept a grant in an amount not to exceed \$305,400.00 in State funds to fund the Department of Public Safety (the "Department")'s participation in the Aid to Crime Labs Program for the period July 1, 2013 to June 30, 2014, pursuant to an approved budget.

The Aid to Crime Labs grant will be used by the Department to enhance the effectiveness, efficiency, reliability and accuracy of its criminal laboratory services. Funding will be applied towards, among other things, costs associated with personnel, fringe benefits, overtime, equipment, travel and supplies.

This contract will serve a public purpose by improving the quality and timeliness of forensic services provided to local law enforcement agencies.

The goals and objectives of this Agreement are to enhance the effectiveness, efficiency, reliability and accuracy of the County's criminal laboratory services by improving the County crime lab's ability to provide timely forensic services through increased analytical capacity and maintain laboratory accreditation.

Acceptance of the grant funds is in the best interests of the County because equipment purchased and personnel costs funded by the funds will enable the crime lab to maintain its accreditation, without which local law enforcement agencies would be forced to outsource their work to other crime labs which would curtail an important revenue stream for the County.

Acceptance of the proposed grant funds will increase safety and security in the County because a more efficient crime lab will be able to deliver faster, more reliable and more accurate forensic services which will aid law enforcement in apprehending criminals faster, thus making the streets safer for County residents.

The performance measures and monitoring of this grant will be reported to DCJS by the Department using the Grant Management System. During the period of this grant, the Department will maintain the assignment of a Detective serving the Department as a Digital Evidence Examiner. The Department will continue to provide DCJS with Accreditation Documentation along with narrative descriptions of how grant funds were used to support Laboratory Accreditation.

Grant funds from the prior Aid to Crime Labs grant year were utilized as follows: salary and fringe benefits for one of the detectives assigned to the Digital Evidence section of the lab; overtime reduced forensic case backlog and supported ASCLD/LAB and NYS Accreditation. Equipment purchases made during the prior grant year included: computers, laboratory barcode printer, laboratory barcode scanner, crime scene laser measuring device, crime scene diagramming software, crime scene camera, training cost for three Digital Evidence Examiners to attend Mobile Device Investigations Training and Access Data Certification School.

Approval of your Honorable Board of an agreement with the State of New York to accept Aid to Crime Labs Program grant funds in the sum of \$305,400.00 is recommended and an appropriate resolution is attached for your consideration.
