SUBJECT: Authority to enter into a grant agreement with the United States Department of Health and Human Services ("HHS"), Administration for Children and Families in order to accept a grant in the amount of \$360,000 to provide a Youth Homelessness Prevention Initiative entitled Westchester Building Futures for the period September 30, 2014 through September 29, 2015 and to enter into agreements utilizing grant funds with: Fordham University in the amount of \$121,141 for program evaluation consulting services, New York University in the amount of \$10,000 for Trauma Systems Therapy Model training, Fordham University in the amount of \$6,000 for trauma-informed child welfare practice training and with Family Ties Inc. in the amount of \$63,665 for the provision of youth advisors and supervision, each for the term September 30, 2014 through September 29, 2015

Authority is respectfully requested from your Honorable Board for the County of Westchester (the "County"), acting by and through its Department of Social Services (the "Department"), to enter into an agreement with the United States Department of Health and Human Services, Administration for Children and Families ("HHS") in order to accept a grant in the amount of \$360,000 (Award No. 90CA1812-02-00) to provide a Youth Homelessness Prevention Initiative entitled Westchester Building Futures for the period September 30, 2014 through September 29, 2015 (the "Grant Agreement") Authority is further requested to enter into agreements, pursuant to the Grant Agreement, as follows:

Fordham University - \$121,141 to provide program evaluation consultant services;
New York University - \$10,000 for Trauma Systems Therapy Model training;
Fordham University - \$6,000 for trauma-informed child welfare practice training;

Family Ties Inc. - \$63,665 for the provision of youth advisors and supervision.

Each of the proposed agreements will be for the term September 30, 2014 through September 29, 2015.

No matching funds are required by the Grant; therefore the Grant Agreement will be at no cost to the County.

I certify that my department, a) has copies of, or access to, all applicable laws, rules, regulations, grant applications, and grant agreements (including any master grant agreement), as well as any guidance or instructions received from the agency making the grant (the "Grant Terms"), b) has reviewed the Grant Terms, c) is aware of and understands all of the Grant Terms, and d) and will comply with all of the Grant Terms.

The grant agreement with HHS is not a procurement therefore the provisions of the Westchester County Procurement Policy do not apply. Because this is a Renewal Grant, the Federal funding for this program is exempt from the Common Grant rules and therefore the agreements with Fordham University, New York University and Family Ties, Inc. may be renewed on a non-competitive basis pursuant to 24 CFR 583.235(a). The proposed agreements, above are exempt from the Westchester County Procurement Policy (the "Policy") pursuant to Policy Section 3(a)(xi) as County funding for this proposed Agreement is pursuant to the Grant Agreement.

The proposed Agreement **will serve a public purpose** by preventing youth homelessness within the County.

The **goals and objectives** of Westchester Building Futures ("WBF"), is a youth and community-driven two-year planning process to develop a detailed blueprint for transforming Westchester's system of public and private resources to prevent homelessness among youth emerging from our child welfare system that can be rigorously evaluated, thoroughly documented, and replicated nationwide.

The **goals and objectives** of the proposed Agreement is **in the County's best interest** regarding **fiscal responsibility** as they will reduce homelessness and dependence on public assistance that not only improves the economic situation of the program participants but of the County as well by reducing the County's public assistance expenditures.

The **goals and objectives** of the proposed Agreements is also **in the County's best interest** regarding **public health and safety** as they provide the funding for and operation of the program to obtain permanent housing and self-sufficiency that correspondingly improves the program participants' physical and psychological well-being and provides a safer and more stable overall environment.

The **performance measurement indicators** for the County WBF will cross four outcome areas: Stable Housing, Permanent Connections, Social and Emotional Well-being and Education/Employment

The **goals and objectives** of the Grant Agreement **will be tracked and monitored** by the County that will include performance measurement indicator results.

Accordingly, authority is hereby requested for the County, acting by and through the Department, to enter into the proposed Grant Agreement and sub-agreements. I respectfully recommend your Honorable Board's approval of the attached Resolution.
