Authority is requested for the County of Westchester to enter into an Agreement with the Westchester Hispanic Coalition, Inc. for the provision of culturally specific sexual assault and domestic violence case management services to Latinas for the period from January 1, 2016 through December 31, 2016 for an amount not to exceed \$100,000 to be paid pursuant to an approved budget and subject to appropriation.

The public purpose of this program is to provide culturally specific sexual assault and domestic violence case management services that address the victimization and complex ramifications of sexual assault in the Latina immigrant community.

The goals and objectives of the Alianza Latina Contra Agresion Sexual Program (ALAS) are to provide culturally specific sexual assault and domestic violence case management services to Latinas such as follows:

- Bilingual/bicultural 24/7 Hotline services
- Community-based teams of volunteer Crisis Counselor-Advocates
- Comprehensive outreach, education and service provision efforts grounded in local Hispanic community and implemented through established social networks.

The goals and objectives of this program are in the best interest of the County in terms of public health and public safety as they are aimed at ensuring and enhancing the health and safety of the targeted population. The 24/7 hotline allows Westchester County residents to receive help in a domestic violence crisis situation by offering options and resources to maximize safety. The County ensures public safety by providing a safe environment to victims of domestic violence and their minor children.

The goals and objectives are in the County's best interest in terms of fiscal responsibility as they are designed to reduce the number of domestic violence incidents which will in turn reduce the costs linked with official emergency response.

The **goals and objectives** will be monitored using the performance measurement indicators developed by the department. The vendor will submit monthly statistics and quarterly performance reports in the format approved by the Department. The program office will be responsible for setting the milestones and tracking their achievements. The Program is also overseen by the Office for Women.

The Department is able to report that the agency has successfully met its goal in serving the targeted population and performing crisis interventions. Given below is a summary of the outcomes achieved under this program in 2015:

The contract is exempt from the Westchester County Procurement Policy pursuant to Section 3(a) xiv as all the clients served under this program are in need of public assistance. This contract is not subject to the competitive procurement requirements of the Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards (formerly, the Grants Management Common Rule) as the federal funding for this program falls under the Social Service Block Grant.

## RESOLUTION

Upon a communication from the Commissioner of the Department of Social Services, be it hereby

**RESOLVED,** that the County of Westchester, acting by and through its Department of Social Services, is hereby authorized to enter into an Agreement with the Westchester Hispanic Coalition, Inc. for the provision of culturally specific sexual assault and domestic violence case management services to Latinas for the period from January 1, 2016 through December 31, 2016 for an amount not to exceed \$100,000 to be paid pursuant to an approved budget; and be it further

**RESOLVED**, that this contract is subject to County Appropriation; and be it further

**RESOLVED**, that this Agreement is also subject to further financial analysis of the impact of any New York State Budget (the "State Budget") proposed and adopted during the term of this Agreement. The county shall retain the right, upon the occurrence of any release by the Governor of a proposed State Budget and/or the adoption of a State Budget or any amendments thereto, and for a reasonable period of time after such release(s) or adoption(s), to conduct an analysis of the impacts of any such State Budget on County finances. After such analysis, the County shall retain the right to either terminate this Agreement or to renegotiate the amounts and rates approved herein. If the County subsequently offers to pay a reduced amount to the Contractor, then the Contractor shall have the right to terminate this Agreement upon reasonable prior written notice; and be it further

**RESOLVED,** that the County Executive or his duly authorized designee is hereby authorized to execute any document and take any action reasonably necessary and appropriate to effectuate the purposes of this Resolution.
