SUBJECT: Authority for the County of Westchester to enter into agreements with thirteen (13) entities to provide summer youth employment programs for economically disadvantaged youth pursuant to the Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF) 2017 Summer Youth Employment Program for the period from June 1, 2017 through September 30, 2017 for an aggregate not-to-exceed amount of \$578,557.00

Attached for your consideration is a resolution which, if approved by your Honorable Board, would authorize the County of Westchester (the "County"), acting by and through its Department of Social Services, on behalf of its Office of Workforce Investment (the "Department"), to enter into thirteen (13) agreements with the thirteen (13) entities listed below to provide summer youth employment programs (the "programs") to economically disadvantaged youth ages 14 to 20 pursuant to the Temporary Assistance to Needy Families ("TANF") 2017 Summer Youth Employment Program (the "SYEP"), with each of the Agreements to be for a term from June 1, 2017 through September 30, 2017 in a total aggregate not-to-exceed amount of \$578,557.00 (the "Agreements").

The thirteen (13) entities and the individual funding amounts for Agreements shall be as follows:

Although this program is exempt from the Westchester County Procurement Policy (the "Policy") pursuant to Section 3 (a) xviii thereof, on April 13, 2017 the Department, on behalf of the Westchester County Office of Workforce Investment, issued an RFP to solicit proposals from public and private non-profit agencies to deliver employment services to various communities in Westchester County during the summer of 2017. The RFP was posted on the County and One Stop websites, the Journal News and emailed to various One Stop partners. Each of the thirteen (13) agencies listed above submitted proposals in response to the RFP. Following a review of each proposal with reference to the evaluation criteria set forth in the RFP, the review committee recommended that each agency be awarded a contract. However, since awarding contracts to every proposer who submitted a proposal does not comport with the Policy's rules, the Department is relying on the exemption referenced above.

The services provided pursuant to the Agreements shall **serve a public purpose** by assisting TANF eligible youth in the County to secure paid summer employment for no less than six (6) weeks.

The **goals and objectives** of the Agreements are to place eligible youth from low income households in subsidized employment to provide them with practical work experience and offer them opportunities to use their talents and learn more about the workplace.

The **goals and objectives** of the Agreements are in the **County's** best interests regarding **fiscal responsibility** because the participating youth will earn an average of \$870.00 during the term of the Agreements which they will use to address their immediate financial needs.

The **goals and objectives** of the Agreements are also in the County's best interest regarding **public safety** because the participating youth are less likely to engage in negative social behavior.

The Department shall **track and monitor** the **goals and objectives** of the Agreements via bi-weekly reports submitted by each of the thirteen (13) listed entities' program staff and through a review of customer case records data. Success and failure of the Agreements will be measured against the following:

1. The successful registration of at least three hundred forty five (345) youth in the programs, and
2. Eighty percent (80%) of youth enrolled in the SYEP will successfully complete six (6) weeks of employment.

RESOLUTION

Upon a communication from the Commissioner of the Department of Social Services, be it hereby

RESOLVED, that the County of Westchester (the “County”) acting by and through its Department of Social Services, Office of Workforce Investment, is hereby authorized to enter into thirteen (13) agreements with the thirteen (13) agencies listed below for each to operate a summer youth employment program pursuant to the Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (“TANF”) 2017 Summer Youth Employment Program (the “Agreements”), with each of the Agreements to be for a term from June 1, 2017 through September 30, 2017 and for a total aggregate not-to-exceed of \$578,557.00, payable pursuant to approved budgets and identified as follows:

RESOLVED, that the Agreements are subject to County appropriations; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Agreements are also subject to further financial analysis of the impact of any New York State Budget (the “State Budget”) proposed and adopted during the term of these Agreements. The County shall retain the right, upon the occurrence of any release by the Governor of a proposed State Budget and/or the adoption of a State Budget or any amendments thereto, and for a reasonable period of time after such release(s) or adoption(s), to conduct an analysis of the impacts of any such State Budget on County finances. After such analysis, the County shall retain the right to either terminate the Agreements or to renegotiate the amounts and rates approved herein. If the County subsequently offers to pay a reduced amount to any of the eleven (11) above listed entities, then each shall have the right to terminate their respective agreements upon reasonable prior written notice; and be it further

RESOLVED that the County Executive or his duly authorized designee is empowered to execute all documents and take all actions necessary to effect the purpose of this resolution.
