SUBJECT: Authority to amend a resolution approved on April 13, 2017, as amended by resolutions approved on August 3, 2017, November 16, 2017, February 22, 2018, April 5, 2018 and August 30, 2018, which together authorized the County of Westchester, acting on behalf of the Westchester-Putnam Local Workforce Development Board, to enter into agreements with each of the one hundred and twenty-seven (127) employers listed in said resolutions, pursuant to which each employer would provide On-the-Job Training and/or Customized Incumbent Worker Training to eligible participants in accordance with the provisions of Title I of the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act of 2014, as amended, and/or other applicable local, state or federal laws, rules or regulations, for the period from January 1, 2017 through June 30, 2021 for a total aggregate amount not-to-exceed \$1,200,000, by adding six (6) additional employers to the list of employers set forth in the previous resolutions

By resolution approved on April 13, 2017 (the "April 13th Resolution"), your Honorable Board authorized the County of Westchester, acting on behalf of the Westchester-Putnam Local Workforce Development Board (the "County"), to enter into agreements with each of the thirty-six (36) employers listed in the April 13th Resolution, pursuant to which each employer would provide On-the-Job Training ("OJT") and/or Customized Incumbent Worker Training ("CIWT") to eligible participants in accordance with the provisions of Title I of the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act of 2014, as amended ("WIOA"), and/or other applicable local, state or federal laws or regulations, for the period from January 1, 2017 through June 30, 2021, for a total aggregate amount not-to-exceed \$1,200,000.

Thereafter, by resolution approved on August 3, 2017 (the "August 3rd Resolution"), your Honorable Board authorized the County to amend the April 13th Resolution by adding sixteen (16) additional employers, as set forth in the August 3rd Resolution, to the list of employers previously authorized under the April 13th Resolution, thereby increasing the total number of

employers authorized to contract with the County under this initiative from thirty-six (36) to fifty two (52).

Thereafter, by resolution approved on November 16, 2017 (the “November 16th Resolution”), your Honorable Board authorized the County to amend the April 13th Resolution, as amended by the August 3rd Resolution, by adding forty-three (43) additional employers, as set forth in the November 16th Resolution, to the list of employers previously authorized under the April 13th Resolution and the August 3rd Resolution, thereby increasing the total number of employers authorized to contract with the County under this initiative from fifty two (52) to ninety-five (95). The November 16th Resolution further authorized the County to amend the April 13th Resolution, as amended by the August 3rd Resolution, in order to change the name of one of the previously approved employers from VeeKast d/b/a Debo Media, Inc. to Debo Media, Inc. d/b/a VeeKast.

Thereafter, by resolution approved on February 22, 2018 (the “February 22nd Resolution”), your Honorable Board authorized the County to amend the April 13th Resolution, as amended by the August 3rd Resolution and the November 16th Resolution, by adding twenty three (23) new employers, as set forth in the February 22nd Resolution, to the list of employers previously authorized by your Honorable Board under the previous resolutions, thereby increasing the total number of employers from ninety-five (95) to one hundred and eighteen (118).

Thereafter, by resolution approved on April 5, 2018 (the “April 5th Resolution”), your Honorable Board authorized the County to amend the April 13th Resolution, as amended by the August 3rd Resolution, the November 16th Resolution and the February 22nd Resolution, by adding four (4) new employers, as set forth in the April 5th Resolution, to the list of employers previously authorized by your Honorable Board under the previous resolutions, thereby increasing the total number of employers from one hundred and eighteen (118) to one hundred and twenty-two (122).

Thereafter, by resolution approved on August 30, 2018 (the “August 30th Resolution”), your Honorable Board authorized the County to amend the April 13th Resolution, as amended by the August 3rd Resolution, the November 16th Resolution, the February 22nd Resolution and the April 5th Resolution, by adding five (5) new employers, as set forth in the August 30th Resolution, to the list of employers previously authorized by your Honorable Board under the previous resolutions, thereby increasing the total number of employers from one hundred and twenty-two (122) to one hundred and twenty-seven (127).

Six (6) additional employers, as listed below, have expressed an interest in participating in this program. Accordingly, authority is respectfully requested to further amend the April 13th Resolution, as amended by the August 3rd Resolution, the November 16th Resolution, the February 22nd Resolution, the April 5th Resolution and the August 30th Resolution, to add the six (6) new employers set forth below to the list of employers previously authorized by your Honorable Board under the previous resolutions, thereby increasing the total number of employers from one hundred twenty-seven (127) to one hundred thirty-three (133).

The six (6) new employers* are:

1. Aqueduct Plumbing and Heating of Putnam County, Inc.
2. Clover Heating. Inc

3. ECM Centers, Inc.
4. Four Point0 Standard LLC dba Kool Nerd Club
5. Law Office Of Richard St. Paul, Esq. PLLC.
6. The Maiaklovsky Law Firm, PLLC.

* There is no set dollar amount for any individual employer.

Each of these employers has submitted to the County an On-Line Business Training Application, and the County has conducted a due diligence review of each employer's application. The employers will be reimbursed for training services rendered in accordance with the requirements of the particular funding source involved, which requirements shall be specified in each employer's individual Training Voucher, which shall be generated for each training request made. It should be noted that there is no set dollar amount for each individual training provider contract. However, the total aggregate amount for all contracts shall not exceed the sum of \$1,200,000.

The Department of Social Services has complied with County and federal procurement rules and procedures by posting an open and continuous solicitation in which qualified businesses can submit an online application on the internet at <https://www.westchesterputnamonestop.com/employer/training-programs>.

Except as specifically amended hereby, all remaining terms and conditions set forth in the April 13th Resolution, as amended by the August 3rd Resolution, the November 16th Resolution, the February 22nd Resolution, the April 5th Resolution and the August 30th Resolution, shall remain in full force and effect.

The proposed Agreements shall serve a public purpose by providing skills training to existing employees to upgrade skill sets and prevent layoffs.

The goals and objectives of the Agreements shall be to provide employees with training to upgrade their employee skill sets and competencies to meet current and future needs.

The goals and objectives of the proposed Agreements are in the County's best interest regarding fiscal responsibility as the upgrading of employee skill sets and competencies benefits both the employer and employee through mutually increased productivity and increased income resulting in beneficial economic benefits to the County through increased tax revenues and reduced dependence on public assistance.

The goals and objectives of the proposed agreements will be tracked and monitored through monthly progress reports submitted by the training providers, program staff and through a review of customer data including services and outcomes in the New York State Department of Labor One Stop Operating System.

I respectfully recommend the adoption of the attached Resolution.
