**SUBJECT:** Request for authority for the County of Westchester ("County") to enter into thirteen (13) agreements ("Agreements") with the contractors listed on the attachment to the resolution ("Contractors") pursuant to which Contractors will operate their remote learning programs for school aged children of essential workers, for a term commencing on October 1, 2020 and continuing through December 30, 2020, for an amount not to exceed \$1,270,771.00, payable monthly, pursuant to an approved budget.

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The attached Resolution, if approved by your Honorable Board, would authorize the County, acting by and through its Youth Bureau, to enter into the Agreements with the Contractors, pursuant to which the Contractors will operate their remote learning programs for school aged children of essential workers ("Programs"), for a term commencing on October 1, 2020 and continuing through December 30, 2020, for an amount not to exceed \$1,270,771.00, payable monthly, pursuant to an approved budget.

The Programs will consist of remote learning programs for school aged children of essential workers residing and/or working throughout Westchester County, and are an educational solution for children to attend on their non-school, remote-learning days. The programs are designed as a place where students can complete coursework from online or at-home classes in a safe, supportive environment with trained staff that are prepared to respond to children's social and emotional needs. Students will be grouped in small, consistent pods with those of similar age and grade levels. The Program Staff, counselors and education specialists are trained to assist with remote learning and schoolwork in an environment that is compliant with the New York State Department of Health, the Westchester County Department of Health, and the New York State Education Department, the Center for Disease Control and coronavirus-related safety and social distancing guidelines.

The proposed Agreements will serve a public purpose by providing essential workers living and working throughout Westchester County with remote learning programs that will provide a safe

and supportive environment for students to access and engage in a remote learning schedule, ensuring continuity of learning.

The goal and objective of the proposed Agreement is for the Contractors to provide remote learning services for up to six hundred school-aged students, who are children of essential workers, at the locations listed in the enclosed attachment. The goal and objective of the proposed Agreement will be tracked and monitored by the County Executive's Site Monitor and the monthly submission of reports.

This allocation of federal funding for remote learning services for the children of essential workers is being provided by the Federal Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security (CARES) Act to prevent, prepare for, and respond to the Coronavirus pandemic. The scope of work includes funding to reimburse operating expenses related to the management and operation of the remote learning centers.

The procurement of the proposed Agreement is exempt from the requirements of the Westchester County Procurement Policy pursuant to Section 3(a) (xviii) thereof, which exempts contracts with persons for the creation and support of recreation projects, youth service projects and other appropriate programs and services for the prevention of delinquency and youth crime and the advancement of the moral, physical, mental and social well-being of the youth of the Westchester County.

Section 13 of the Westchester County Procurement Policy specifies that each procurement that is funded, in whole or in part, by federal funds shall be made in accordance with any and all applicable federal laws, regulations, rules, guidance, instructions, or grant terms. Specifically, this procurement complies with 2 C.F.R. 200.320(f) (2), which allows for noncompetitive procurement when "the public exigency or emergency for the requirement will not permit a delay resulting from competitive solicitation." This agreement qualifies based on the public exigency that currently exists and the urgent need for drop in remote learning child care services for essential workers living and working throughout Westchester County.

I respectfully recommend the adoption of the attached resolution.
